LEAD PASTOR REPORT

Born in Africa in 1940, world-class runner Kipchoge Keino was a legend, earning world records and two Olympic gold medals. Keino registered for three races in the 1968 Olympics in Mexico City. Few people knew until after the Olympics that doctors had strongly recommended that Keino not compete because of gallstones. However, one hour before the 1,500-meter event, Keino decided to run despite medical orders. If gallstones were not bad enough, the bus he took to the stadium became stuck in traffic and would have made him late for the start of the race. So Keino decided to run two miles to the stadium, just in time to participate in the race. What's even more impressive, Keino won the event more than twenty meters ahead of the reigning champ, Jim Ryun.

It's an incredible true-life story that parallels nicely with the Christian Race. What would happen if we listened to every negative voice or suggestion? We would most likely sit on the sidelines for most of our existence. Some would say Keino was born to race, and in many ways, we have been, too, born (again) to run the race Jesus has set before us.

The Apostle Paul penned this reminder in the Book of Hebrews: "Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a huge crowd of witnesses to the life of faith, let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us." Hebrews 12:1 NLT

"We do this by keeping our eyes on Jesus, the champion who initiates and perfects our faith." **Hebrews 12:2 NLT**A successful runner, based on Paul's words in Hebrews 11, is someone who:

- Values role models/mentors who encourage
- Disposes of excess baggage/junk
- Keeps Jesus in sight

It is a great race map and the key to running a successful race. New Hope, run the race with endurance until you cross the finish line and meet our Champion face to face!

The **2022-23 Church Year** experienced a race like no other year for New Hope.

Here are a few highlights from the 2022-23 race (May 1, 2022 – April 30, 2023):

- Sunday morning average in-person attendance **249** (Kentville 183, Kingston 66)
- 16 people accepted Jesus as Lord & Saviour
- 9 people baptized
- 3 child dedications
- Pastor Dave became Lead Campus Pastor at Kingston

- Financial giving increased: regular by **6.5%** & Christmas Eve Offering by **10%**
- Weekly average for Online Sunday Services **37** (IP addresses)

A few other race highlights:

- Hopehuddles had another great year and continues to be foundational for the life of New Hope. **15 Huddles** gathered in homes throughout the Valley, with approximately **120 people** attending and participating in the weekly Huddles. A prayer request for our Huddle Ministry is for God to raise up more Huddle leaders!

The return of THRIVE has been good fuel for the race too. Two highlights from our monthly THRIVE:

- Healing Service AND Hosted the National Prayer Tour for Canada

Both were significant nights of prayer and worship!

In looking ahead, the race set out before us does have a few hurdles to overcome:

- Recruitment/retention of volunteers continues to be a challenge. Most of our ministries need more volunteers.
- A giving thrust that would eliminate our current Kentville mortgage, replace the leaking roof and launch another New Hope location.
- Serious traction for a third location. (Windsor)

Stay tuned as the leadership at New Hope actively engages initiatives to help with these hurdles.

These are good days for New Hope, God is moving, and there is a high sense of optimism. It is certainly not time to sit in the stands or on a bus stuck in traffic. Now is the time to run the race before us. Timothy writes some great words about running.

"I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, and I have remained faithful." **2 Timothy 4:7 NLT**"And now the prize awaits me - the crown of righteousness, which the Lord, the righteous Judge, will give me on the day of his return. And the prize is not just for me but for all who eagerly look forward to his appearing." **2 Timothy 4:8 NLT**

Remember, the race you are running is not singular. It is a race that involves God and others.

In closing, C.S. Lewis offered this thought about life's race. "Now God designed the human machine to run on Himself."
He Himself is the fuel our spirits were designed to burn, or the food our spirits were designed to feed on. There is no other."

There is no other, only God and God alone. I am looking forward to the race in 2023-24!

YOUTH & MEDIA REPORT

New Hope family another year has gone by and once again it has been a year filled with some unexpected challenges but I am excited for where we are now and where we are going as a church! We have seen a number of incredible things happen this pas year and God has very much been faithful.

Hope Youth (Kentville & Kingston)

Here are some quick stats about Hope Youth this past year...

- 2 Graduates
- 2 Baptisms
- 7 Decisions to follow Jesus
- 22 Average Weekly Attendance
- 43 Different teens have attended a youth event at lease once

This past summer our youth group attended the one day one con event. Our group of 6 joined 800 other teens and leaders in a day of worship/games and teaching in what was our first large group event post pandemic. It was an incredible day together and emphasized the need for community. In the fall a group of 4 of us travelled to Kingswood University for Encounter weekend. This was also a great time connecting with teens and leaders across the maritimes. When we launched youth in the fall we saw a large influx of new middle school students in Kingston. We presented the gospel to the group in the fall and had 7 teens make a decision to follow Jesus! We also had a missions night where we were able to donate over 50 items to the local food bank.

One of the challenges with the growth in our group was keeping control of the group as they were mostly new to youth and we were much larger than we had previously been. We were lucky to find a new leader and have been running the youth alpha program which has given our youth nights much more structure. Going forward when we have completed Alpha we will keep this format as it has helped create a much more structured youth night and helped us control the larger group.

I would ask you to pray for the youth group. That we would see the teens of New Hope fall in love with Jesus and be a beacon of Hope for our community. I also would ask you to pray for the teens who attend youth but their families do not attend church. That they would be the spark in their home that ignites a flame for Jesus.

This year we continued to livestream our weekly services at New Hope. We also added the option to listen to the

audio version of not only the Kentville campus sermon but the Kingston campus sermon as well. These audio versions are available on Spotify and on Apple Podcast.

This year we recorded a number of remote videos. Some of the highlights for me were the Christmas Eve promo video as well as our mothers day video. We also recorded a special song for Easter, the video for that song was recorded out at Bernadines barn which brought back many memories from my first Christmas at New Hope where we recorded at the barn. That music video had by far the most engagement of any video we released this year. We have also continued recording our announcements weekly.

We recorded a special service this year for Christmas Day as we were "Online only" A special thank you to Eric and Joanne Mitchell who allowed us to take over their living room for a day as we recorded an entire service remotely. In particular it was a fun challenge figuring out how to record the audio for the music.

Website

I also partnered with a company called 'ehDesign' this past year to launch a new website. Part of this process included bringing in a photographer to help us have professional pictures for the website. I now maintain the site regularly as part of my weekly tasks. This was a long process that at times I felt unsure we would ever cross that finish line but I am happy with the final product.

I want to say thank you to all who have supported me in my time at New Hope and I continue to be excited for what is coming next and hope you will join me on the journey.

CHILDREN'S PASTOR REPORT

Being part of New Hope has been a big blessing to Aaron and myself this past year and we are so happy to be in this wonderful church community.

*Please note that I was one of the Assistant Campus Pastor's in Kingston from *May 2021-August 2022*. I then shadowed under Pastor Mariah for Children's Ministry & in *October 2022* I became the temporary Children's Pastor. This is my role until she returns from maternity leave.

HopeKids

- Planning Sunday morning.
- Recruiting new leaders.
- Scheduling leaders and handing out curriculum every month.
- Weekly emails and monthly Facebook posts.
- Decorating the HopeKids rooms in Kingston and Kentville for holidays/seasons.

While in Kingston:

- I was the point person if anyone had questions about HopeKids or wanted to get involved, they came to me.
- Taught about once per month.
- Set up the new shelving in the HopeKids room with help from Pastor Dave.

While in Kentville:

- I attend HopeKids almost every service. I usually lead the discussions, an activity, and the worship.
- Conducted a HopeKids moment during the Family service on Sunday, July 31st. We gave out ice cream at the end of the service.
- Attended a Plan to Protect meeting over Zoom on October 15th.
- Attended a Plan to Protect meeting with our leaders on October 23rd and 25th.
- Christmas Activities: Decorated Hope Meadow and Kingston HopeKids. Prepared take-home Advent Calendar activities. Made mugs and cards for all our leaders. Created a HopeKids music video.
- Carols and Desserts (December 4th): Read The Legend of the Candy Cane on stage with the kids.
- The Gingerbread Bash (December 18th): Pastor Mariah helped a lot before going on maternity leave. We had almost 100 people show up between both locations! We used the same curriculum as last year. We received lots of donations from the church! Heather Hockley helped with putting together the gingerbread house containers (and more!).
- Christmas Eve: Pastor Dan and I recorded the countdown. We had one service in Kingston and two in Kentville. I helped set up the egg nogg and hot apple cider after each service.
- Christmas Day: We pre-recorded the service. I read a story my family would read together every Christmas.

- Pastor Jedie and I put together a brochure for HopeKids in January. We give this to new families so they can know all the important information for Sunday morning. We decided to do this instead of explaining everything during their first sign-in because it can get hectic and they won't remember everything we tell them. This helps them to refer back to what we've explained.
- Started a monthly Memory Verse Challenge in February at both locations. Each week, the children can bring their Bibles, find our monthly verse by themselves, and/or recite the verse by memory in order to gain points. At the end of the month, we draw for a prize at each service. The kids in Kentville have really taken to this and are excited to win the prizes. We are still trying to entice the kids in Kingston. We have found that a lot of children do not have Bibles, so we are trying to find a way to provide some for them.
- Opened Hope Farm for the first time since Covid on February 5th! This is for kids ages 4-5. We do not have this open on the last Sunday of each month because we do not have enough leaders at the moment.
- Planned/prepped special activities for Christmas, Valentine's Day, Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Mothers Day.
- The Easter Eggstravaganza (April 8th). MANY trips to the stores. Created donation posters for both campuses. Went to many businesses to ask for donations for our two prize baskets. Aaron and I picked up over 200 rocks for one of the crafts. Ordered prizes online (my Hope Huddle helped to fill over 1200 eggs with prizes and 220 packages of jellybeans!) Edited and printed 220 Easter Storybooks. With the help three awesome leaders, we filled 220:Take-home bags, Cups with sprinkles, Small bags with candy, and Bags of jellybeans. Planned and bought supplies for 7 activity tables. Booked a bouncy castle. Recruited leaders. We had over 200 kids, approximately 100 adults! It was packed and chaotic, but we had a great time and the kids had a blast! Some of these families have started coming to New Hope! This could not have been done without the 20+ leaders that tirelessly helped with this event. **Thank you!** And a very special **thank you** to Heather Hockley. She worked countless hours cutting, prepping, filling, and brainstorming. I don't know what I would have done without her. She is a blessing to this church and all ministries!
- Pastor Scott and I interviewed Bronwyn Knowlton on April 27^{th,} and she started working as our Summer Intern on May 2nd! We are very excited to have her. She will be doing some creative jobs and planning some events and activities for our HopeKids this Summer.
- Planned a HopeKids promo video in collaboration with Pastor Dan, which will be presented sometime in May or June. This will help the congregation understand the WHY of HopeKids and how to get involved.
- The kids at both campuses are fun to be with and ask very good questions about Jesus. They are very smart and want to dive deeper in their faith, which is awesome! I love working with them!



My highlight for **October** was attending something called the well on the 25th. The well is a gathering of church pastors and leaders to lift one another up in prayer to encourage one another and to learn together how to do ministry. At this particular well we met for lunch afterwards and discussed homelessness in our area. This has become an epidemic in the Valley. We have families living in tents year-round and we were looking for solutions to build micro shelters on church properties. On **November** 2nd we had our district gathering in Halifax at Den Guptill's church. The District Superintendent Reverend Peter Moore came to speak to us and challenged us in many different ways. What most stood out for me was Pastor AJ Thomas' challenge to grow closer to God. It was at this meeting that I committed to a weekly Sabbath. I have not looked back since. This has been a no tech, life altering, decision for me.

In **December** the wonderfully generous people of New Hope Kingston donated enough groceries to put together 10 hampers for those who would otherwise not have food for Christmas Day. We partnered with the Salvation Army church in Bridgetown and allowed them to choose who these hampers would go to. Much to our great delight every one of these hampers went to a Ukrainian family. God is so amazing and so good.

On **January** 29th we had our first pizza with the pastors in quite a while. There was a great turn out. Because it had been a while there were over 20 people in attendance and lots and lots of great questions. This is a wonderful welcoming venue for new families to meet the pastors and discover more about the Wesleyan Church and what we stand for.

On **February** 5th we had our first Thrive in a very long time. The atmosphere was charged with the Holy Spirit. There were 18 in attendance. We closed off with a time of anointing and healing prayer. It is so good to meet for corporate prayer once again. CADETS MINISTRY REPORT

We are having another exciting year at Cadets. Our goal is to have fun, play games, learn skills, explore different activities, but most of all, to start or continue building a relationship with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and with each other.

This year our numbers have diminished very slightly. We have 13 boys registered, with an average of 9 attending per meeting. We also have three Adult Counsellors and one Junior Counsellor. So we continue to have a great Cadet to Counsellor ratio.

Our theme this season is "Amazing", based on Joshua 3:5 which says "Joshua told the people, "Consecrate yourselves, for tomorrow the Lord will do amazing things among you." On our kick off night we had our own "Amazing Race". Stats

- Since Dec 2020 We have had 17 new people who were presented with the New Comers 101 presentation. This allows people to gain an understanding of the overall program and provides them an opportunity to ask any questions or concerns they might have. Over the last couple months we have been having an average attendance of 10 to 12 people on Tuesday nights.
- Financially, our weekly donations have allowed us to be self supporting. Praise God!

Praise Items

- We feel blessed that God has shown us favor in having CR for well over a decade. We are thankful for the continued support of the Pastoral Team. A special note of gratitude to Doug Morgan who has supported us from the beginning. Doug still assists with the sound system & our music when we need an extra hand. A special thanks to leaders Derek & Terri Wilson who have been active in this program since the beginning.

Special Events

- This past summer we had a BBQ once a month, followed by our regular meeting. We did this in June, July and August. They were well attended and seemed to be enjoyed by those present. It was a delightful fellowship time. Everyone worked well together setting the event up and with the clean up after.
- In December we enjoyed a Christmas social. We had a potluck followed by a program of carol singing. Alex and Sarah Sanford, led the music and singing. This is the third year that Alex and Sarah have helped us with our program. After having Covid restrictions for two years, it was a delight to meet together in this way. After the social we had our regular Tuesday night meeting. In the large group share, we watched Skit Guys as a change from our usual Testimony/step study presentation.

Projects Completed

- We have no new projects. However, we continue to advertise our weekly meetings in the Grapevine and on Valley events listing. We also continue to put up informative posters with tear slips in various locations.

Challenges

- This year we have been facing a difficult challenge. Our ministry leader, David Hazelwood, stepped down from his position due to health concerns. David has been in this position for 4 years. He was a dedicated, committed leader who showed concern for the welfare of each person who attended the program. He is greatly missed and we are all praying that God will favor him with renewed health.
- This presently leaves us with four leaders, 3 women and one man. Although, through the grace of God, we

have been having our weekly meetings, the reality is this can not continue long term. Thus far, 5 months has passed with the four of us keeping the CR program working. CR is a heavy commitment as we hold meetings every week. We do not take any time off not even at Christmas or during the summer months.

We need more leaders. We appreciate the New Hope Ministry team who has posted our need for leaders each Sunday. So far no one has stepped forward. We initially had hope that someone who once was a leader would come back to help. So far no one has. We have approached the participants in both the ladies and men group to see if anyone was interested in taking a step study. However no one showed an interest in leading. To be the CR Leader one has to finish a 12 step study. The study takes several months to complete.

Hopes For The Future

- Present leaders and participants desire for CR to continue. All realize the value of this program. All agree that God uses CR to transform lives. God is in control and we believe our prayers will be answered.

GRIEFSHARE MINISTRY REPORT

People find themselves in a lonely and vulnerable position when a loved one dies. GriefShare offers practical tips and hope to those grieving. It is a Biblically based 13 week program that deals with different aspects of grief. One comment we hear over and over again from participants is that they felt so alone before joining with others who are travelling the grief journey. So many of these folks express their appreciation to New Hope for offering GriefShare

Our Fall session of GriefShare began on September 12, 2022. Jason Chesley and Bernadine Gerrits co-facilitated the semester with the faithful help of Pastor Karen and Rudy Halbersma. We had 9 people attend regularly along with the 4 on the leadership team for a total of 13 people at GriefShare most nights. We split into two small groups for discussion time. There were 5 others that dropped in for 2 or 3 sessions. One of our regular participants had a baby in Nov. She would walk over an hour every Monday night to attend!

- We also ran an intimate 'Loss of a Spouse' event for 5 widows within our church family on Sept 17, 2022. We hope to run this one day session on a broader level again this coming Fall.
- On Nov 26, 2022, we held what has become an annual "Surviving The Holidays' event. This is also a one day event which is usually very well received. Sixteen people attended this year.
- After a few month's break, we began the Winter/Spring semester on Feb 6, 2023. The leadership team of Jason, Bernadine, Karen and Rudy continued in their roles. Four participants joined us when we began. The group grew over the next few weeks to 8 regular participants for a total of 12 people gathered to learn, share, and heal at our GriefShare meetings.
- We hope to begin with GriefShare again in Sept. We will have the brand new 4.0 version of the program. As leaders, we are excited about this! We trust it will be every bit as good and even more relevant than the previous one.

We thank you for making this valuable program available to those within our community who are grieving. We ask you to pray for those who have participated in the past and for those who will join us in the future. We also ask you to pray for more folks to be called to our leadership team as some cannot commit to the Fall program.

IMMIGRANT CONNECTION REPORT

Background

- Till this day, I'm grateful to Pastor Scott (& pastoral team) who has taken me in under his wings since late Fall 2019 for ministry to Internationals. We gave it a name, Immigrant Connection, the same name adopted by the Wesleyans in the States. Then, the hiatus throughout 2020~2021 when the world was hit by the Covid pandemic. As a result, only a handful among the congregation came to know about this ministry. One family that keeps me going until this day is none other than the Case's. I'm deeply grateful for the Case couple (Lorraine & Doug) in the recent years for opening their home to host newcomers for outreach purpose.

Who & Where

Immigrant Connection ministry is meant to reach out to Internationals that choose to make Canada their new home, be it short term, mid term or long term.

- International students, NSCC and Acadia
- Migrant workers such as nurses, personal support workers, hired for hospitals, nursing homes, rehabilitation centres, VON, and L'Arche.
- Migrant workers, hired by the food processing plants and other manufacturing plants.
- Migrant workers, hired for the food & beverage sector and agricultural sector such as vineyards, vegetables farms, orchards like apple, blueberries, strawberries, etc.
- In fact, many of them are here to stay to work towards permanent residency.

Thanks to organizations such as Valley Learning Community Association (VCLA), Flying Squirrel Adventures, Kentville Business Community that put out community events all year round to bring people together, newcomers from away or from abroad, and locals as well. By being out there for specific events that draw newcomers, you would see me there mingling with familiar and unfamiliar faces. The Community Supper hosted by VCLA, is one good avenue where I have friendship moments with familiar faces. Over time, God had orchestrated 'behind the scene' and brought into my path a few good contacts; exceptionally sincere and open to my Christian belief.

Praise Items

It had been a rewarding experience when you received words of affirmation from newcomers; those who had been touched by God through Bee.

- "Bee is able to listen to the needs of a newcomer, and then give suggestions that could work for you and help you reach your goals." (Mexican, Feb 2023)
- "The person I'm talking about here is none than Bee Meisu. You have an impeccable manner. You're such a light in the dark. Thank you for everything you've done." (Nigerian, Jan 2023)

Back to school: mid-Jan to end May 2023

Distance Learning (virtual), highly intensive pastoral training for pastors, missionaries and lay leaders. The stress had been acutely intense because of the back-to-back deadlines, week after week throughout the months. As a result, my anxiety and sleep issue had worsened at certain points in time. It took me immense discipline to do the needful to tackle my health issues while doing studies I'm so pleased to share that my last day of school is on the 28th of May. To God, be all praises and all glory!

Special Events

- 2022 Fall BBQ at church newcomers, a married couple from HK and a single adult from Nigeria were invited to their first Sunday service at NHW. They are 'born again' believers, and they felt warmly welcomed, and overall experience was positive.
- Thanksgiving Day -apart from the international students, the Case had been very generous to host a couple from Singapore for one night. They visited Nova Scotia to have some groundwork done prior to future relocation 'work-in-progress'. The highlight of that day was a testimony given by a newcomer. It was his personal experience of God's miraculous intervention, from homelessness to provision from the Lord. I believe God would do his thing to speak life into these non-believers who were present then
- Community Supper -I came to know of a local church doing a community supper on Christmas Day. They meant to open up to the community, including newcomers from abroad. I was over the moon when the group of Mexicans accepted my invitation. The whole Christmas experience was traditionally classical, yet deeply profound because the true meaning of Christmas was being shared. I could see that our Mexican newcomers were mesmerised throughout the service. Some of them said it was their first time hearing these traditional Christmas carols. I trust God for the sowing of seeds in their minds and hearts on that very day (Dec 25, 2022).
- Lunar New Year -we had the privilege of having Acadia students with us, two from Malaysia, one from Sri Lanka and one more from Nova Scotia. We had a great time catching up with them, and hearing of their future goals in the short term and long term. I left with each a gift package: a friendship card and Word of God booklet when it was time to say Good-bye. I trusted that the gift would serve as a reminder of God's agape love for each, and that our warm hospitality may lead them to seeking the biblical truth of life.

Special Projects

- Newcomer in need of housing: It was in late August that both B.S and I crossed paths at NSCC. Little did I knew that God already knew about this man and his predicament. He put me right there for something bigger than what my mind could conceive. He was left 'homeless' due to the worsening of the housing crisis. I did my due diligence and let God did the rest. Miraculously, he landed in a rental property eventually.
- Solidifying the presence of IC on campus, NSCC Kingstec: Moving forward, I ask of God's favour that I shall be granted a meeting with the head of Student Services of NSCC, Kingstec campus. Lord's willing, may this come to past this summer. The goal is to have NSCC recognise Immigrant Connection (IC) as one of their

community partners in the long term. May Immigrant Connection be one resource that they can safely rely on, especially for students in critical situations that are beyond their scope of support.

Goals for the New Church Year

- Mobilizing, Encouraging, Participating: Praise God for the groundwork already laid in Canada in cities such as Toronto, Ottawa, Calgary, Edmonton and Vancouver. Welcome Church is a cross-denominational agency, established to engage mainstream churches through webinars/videos/testimonies so that they may catch the heartbeat of Jesus to welcome strangers into our midst. New Hope can tap on the invaluable resources available so as to advocate, equip and gather the like-minded ones to create a welcoming space for friends from around the globe immigrants, migrant workers and students from the local areas.
- Intentional Intercessionary Prayers: Prayer is like a lifeline to keep us moving and alive as a church. It is important that God's people take responsibility as intercessors to pray for the pastoral/leadership team and all ministries happening inside and outside the church. One way is to encourage such intercessory prayers through Hope Huddles. Since they are meeting on a weekly basis; they can pray for one particular ministry, one at a time. Possibly, over the span of 7-8 weeks, all ministries may be covered, and then they can repeat the cycle down the road. Another avenue is through Thrive, where ministries can be prayed for. Perhaps, we can have themes like Children for one month, and Internationals for another month.

May the Lord raise up many more intercessors because prayer can help to draw each to be closer and intimate with Christ Jesus. As a church, the more concerted our prayer is for one another, the more the power of the Lord to be manifested, the more healing and deliverance may follow suit. "Do not be afraid or discouraged because of this vast army. For the battle is not yours, but God's." (2 Chron 20:15)


