





As people walked through the door it indicated their desire to ask Jesus into their heart, recommit their life, &/or surrender hurts or grief to Jesus.







LEAD PASTOR REPORT

Zhang Rongliang is the founder of one of the largest churches in China. It is reported that over 10 million members point to him as their spiritual leader, which has resulted in great persecution for Zhang.

In early December 2004, the Chinese government took Zhang into custody, where he remained for seven years and six months for being a believer in Jesus Christ. However, Zhang testified that he did not see those years in prison as wasted time. When news of his imprisonment got out, individuals from around the globe pleaded for his release. Thousands of letters were written on Zhang's behalf, and thousands more were praying for his freedom.

It was a bit of a surprise when Zhang wrote to one of his Christian friends: "I am happy that you and others tried to arrange for my release, but in one way, I am happy that you failed." Was Zhang joking? Was he genuinely happy that he was not released from a Chinese prison? Zhang continued in the letter, "You almost made a big mistake."

According to the faithful Chinese pastor, God used him to start up a "church" in prison where he and 5,000 men were being held. Zhang was happy/blessed that God used him in the centre of persecution and imprisonment. It is an incredible story of perseverance and faith.

Paul talks about perseverance/faith while expounding on love in action. The Apostle writes - *Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.* **Romans 12:12 NLT** A bold verse to live up to. Are you joyful in hope, patient in affliction and faithful in prayer? Do you have a level of grit and determination for Jesus like Zhang? Unfortunately, we often default to whining and bellyaching about our predicament.

The story of Zhang offers multiple discussion points, both personally and corporately:

- 1st If God used Zhang in the blatant face of persecution, what is our excuse in the Annapolis Valley for not being used by God where very little persecution exists?
- **2**nd God always uses the faithful and willing. Be faithful and willing.
- **3rd** What seems unfair and like a prison can become great moments where God uses the faithful to accomplish great things.
- **4**th We make mistakes; God does not. New Hope is in a season of incredible blessings. It is no mistake that God is preparing us for an incredible future.

In many ways, **2023-24 has been New Hope's best ministry days**, and I can testify the same. Some highlights from our best days would be (May 1, 2023 – April 30, 2024):

- Sunday Morning In-person Avg. Attendance: **300** (An increase of 17% over the previous year) **Kentville 203** & **Kingston 97**)
- 21 Salvations
- 13 Baptisms
- 7 Child Dedications
- 11% Increase in Regular Financial Giving
- Weekly average for Online Sunday Services **30** (IP addresses)
- Child Sponsorship through Compassion **57** (worldwide)

In these excellent days, we must only linger briefly, or we will become stuck in past accomplishments. In honouring the past and offering appropriate thanksgiving to God, we must look forward to where God wants to use us for continued Kingdom growth. In the words of John Wesley, 'The BEST is YET to COME!'

There is so much we do not know when looking ahead. However, God-willing we must:

- Be even more reliant on the Holy Spirit.
- Replace the roof at the Kentville location in the summer of 2024.
- Conduct a Giving Campaign to eliminate our current Kentville mortgage and launch another New Hope location or two (Windsor/Bridgewater). The LBA has approved a launch date of September 8, 2024, for our Giving Campaign.
- Hope Signs in both locations become fully lit, representing lives transformed through the Power of Jesus.
- The realization of 20 Huddles in both locations with 180-200 people attending the Huddles.

There is much work to be completed, and I am thankful for the Holy Spirit, who empowers and equips the saints.

In closing, a very special **thank you** for my recognition on October 15, 2023, for serving 25 years as your Lead Pastor. It was meaningful, inspiring, and generous. Thank you, Pastor Jedie, Susan Amirault (Vice-chair of LBA), Staff, and the Church, for making an old guy feel special.

May the truth from this past hymn be a guide for future days.

New Hope Family, it is a great privilege to serve as your Assistant Pastor this past church fiscal year. Thank you so much for making my service to God and His Church a truly rewarding experience! Thank you to Pastor Scott, our incredible staff, the church board, and to the entire church family for supporting, encouraging, and expressing how much you appreciate Mariah and I, and for your expressions of love towards our daughter Nora. We feel motivated to give our best to God, His Church, and our community.

I have had the joy of being involved in many positive ministry events and experiences such as:

- I considered it a great privilege to be 'Interim Pastor' for 2 months while Pastor Scott was on Sabbatical (Aug. '23'). God taught me about surrender, relying upon Him and time/staff management. Thank you church family for your prayers and support especially during that extra responsibility
- Planning the celebration service (Oct. 15 '23) for Pastor Scott & Shari in honour of 25 years of faithful service at New Hope. I was so pleased to see 130 people attend the event to offer their congratulations. The celebration was filled with laughter and tears by Pastor Scott and Shari which made the event worth it!

- It was a special moment to have my dad **dedicate** our daughter Nora to the Lord (Oct. 8 '23) as Mariah and I made our commitments before our church family.
- Starting in January '24, I began participating in a 'leadership development' Co-Hort of about a dozen, up-and-coming Assistant pastors, led by our District Superintendent Rev. Peter Moore.

I have responsibility of overseeing the following areas: Worship Ministry, First Impressions, Promotional/Church Materials, Co-Lead the Staff Meetings, and In-House Documents/Procedures. Here are a few highlights...

Worship Ministry

We are blessed by their commitment, and to have them faithfully serve God and our church family! Special thank you to Marlee Dietert who has been a co-worship leader and passionately leads our church family in worship at our Kentville location.
- We are blessed with <u>35</u> highly skilled and passionate worship team members between Kentville & Kingston, and I am very grateful for their commitment to serve and give God their best in worship. Also, we recruited <u>5</u> new team members (Kentville & Kingston).
- <u>Updates</u>: We purchased a new subwoofer and wireless headset microphone for Kingston, and had additional stage lighting installed pointing towards the cross in Kingston. Special thanks to Jason Chesley for providing the electrical and Pastor Dan for his assistance with installing the subwoofer.
- I assisted Pastor Scott with planning and leading the music for our monthly **THRIVE**: Worship & Prayer services (Oct., Nov., Jan. & Feb.) We tried something new by having each staff member be in charge of planning 1 THRIVE service in whatever creative way they would like (March, April, May, June).
- I was excited to oversee the planning of our family-fun event, 'Carols & Desserts' (Dec. 10 '23) at our Kentville location. We saw 170+ people attend and included singing carols, funny interactive moments, prizes and delicious deserts in the lobby. Special thank you to members of the Kentville & Kingston worship team who passionately led the music, along with Heather Hockley, Susan Amirault (+Huddle) for planning and serving the delicious festive desserts + cleaning up afterwards! Also, thank you to those who made desserts!
- I oversaw the planning of our **Christmas Eve Services** at both locations which included a funny skit, singing Christmas carols, special moments, videos, message, candle-lighting, and festive drinks in the lobby afterwards. There were <u>494</u> people that attended (Kentville & Kingston)
 - a) (Dec. 23 Kingston) I was pleased to have a Kingston *only* worship team skilfully and passionately lead the music. Special thanks to Pastor Dave for overseeing the service in Kingston.
 - b) **(Dec. 24 Kentville)** It was a joy to lead the singing, and I was honoured to share the stage with Lindsay Ward as we sang, "Light of the World: Sing Hallelujah". Also, Pastor Dan and I depicted a funny skit as Joseph (me) booked a trip with the Travel Agent (Dan) to Bethlehem last minute.
- I oversaw the planning of our Easter Weekend Services (Mar. 29 & 30 '24).

 - b) Easter Sunday: Cardboard testimonies (special thanks to Pastor Karen), and I also enjoyed being part of a special music video, "Who You Are To Me" with the talented Marlee Dietert & Alex Sanford. Special thanks to Pastor Dan for all his time and effort to edit/record this special video.
- I was very grateful to **Jon & Haleigh Enserink** for their creativity, time and effort to oversee and implement our Christmas stage design for Kentville! Over the last year we have redesigned the platform <u>3</u> times. Special thanks to Pastor Scott, Pastor Mariah, Wayne & Linda Isnor, & Heather Hockley for their practical support!
- Special thanks to Susan Amirault, Heather Hockley & Linda Isnor for their time and effort to creatively and festively design our Kentville lobby for Christmas.

- It is my privilege to oversee and support the important ministries of our Greeters and Ushers at our Kentville location. **Thank you** to the many who served so faithfully in these ministries by genuinely welcoming others to our church family!! We welcomed **4 new member**s to the greeters ministry.
- I took over the weekly e-bulletin in August 2023 that includes upcoming events and access to relevant info about our upcoming church events and happenings.
- Something new... We had the upper landing wall (Kentville) painted blue (thanks to Dave Hazelwood) and our church logo (thanks to Colleen Gerrits) in anticipation for our congregation's creative respond to the sermon that weekend. On April 14, 2024 I preached about 'Holy Spirit Empowerment' and the challenge was for our church family to shine our light and witness for Jesus this year. I was blown away when I witnessed 88 people (Kentville) and 55 (Kingston) publicly express their commitment to talk to someone this year about Jesus by placing their 'hand-print' on the wall next to our Church logo!
- <u>Updated/New:</u> We reupholstered the 4 black lobby chairs in Kentville (June 2023) by a gentleman in Kentville this was a major cost savings compared to purchasing new! We updated our Parking Lot Sandwich Board signs with our new church logo (Kentville & Kingston) and provided a 'Church Office Sign' for Kentville that directed those who are unfamiliar with our church to drive around to the lower level Special thanks to Wayne & Linda Isnor for their help with installing!

She and her husband attend the Kingston location and she has a huge passion for youth ministry, having volunteered in many youth groups. Our group is mostly middle school girls so having her has been amazing.

I'd like to **publicly thank Pastor Megan** for investing into the HopeKids Ministry while I was on leave and would like to acknowledge that any special events listed below from May-November 2023 took place under her leadership.

2023-2024 Ministry Highlights

Stats:

Our average attendance for this church year is **78**, with the average attendance for each service being:

From May 2023 – April 2024, I have been involved in the following, **Spiritual care pastor:**

I am very excited to have the official role of Spiritual Care Pastor at New Hope! This role has allowed me to dedicate more time to supporting our church members through their difficult times. I have had the privilege of meeting with many individuals in coffee shops, their homes, and on walks, providing a safe space for them to share their struggles while offering love, non-judgment, and Godly guidance. My efforts have been enriched by attending numerous mental health webinars and seeking the Holy Spirit's guidance.

In the coming year, my goal is to deepen my understanding of mental health and integrate healthy practices within our church community. I plan to achieve this by continuing to watch webinars and enrolling in a few specialized courses. CAMPUS PASTOR REPORT

Below are a few highlights from this past church year, along with challenges to be aware of & goals for the year ahead.

Highlights

- Baptized **seven individuals** one of whom gave their life to Jesus after saying the sinner's prayer found in the back of a New Hope gift Bible.
- To encourage greater relational connection within the church family, we had three potlucks throughout the summer. These were hosted by different people in our congregation. Attendance was between **40-55** each time. We intend to do this again this summer.
- Received **sixteen people** into membership from the Kingston location, plus one transfer.
- Launched a **prayer ministry team** that is available to pray with people following every Sunday service.
- Purchased **fifty-three new chairs** to replace the fold-up ones we were using. The church was able to raise the \$5000+ needed.
- Within the community, we participated in the following ministries: Christmas food hampers, Salvation Army Christmas Kettles, Heart of the Valley Nursing Home, Blessings in a Backpack, and the Upper Room Food Bank.
- Numerically, NH Kingston is the largest it has ever been since opening in 2018. On any given Sunday, our attendance is in the **90 -110 range**.

Challenges

- With church growth comes more work especially for the pastor(s). As we continue to grow, I will need to be diligent at offloading/delegating tasks to capable volunteers. Over this past year, I have been able to hand off the following ministries: Love Atlantic planning, cleaning the church, greeters/tellers scheduling, and monthly nursing home church services.
- From a facilities standpoint, we are getting closer to max capacity especially in the Hope Kids department. To facilitate future growth, significant decisions will have to be made that will not be popular. Things such as having Hope Kids run the entire service, in order to free up more chairs in the sanctuary, and eventually going to two services. Maximizing our current space, rather than building new or finding a larger building, seems to make the most sense from a stewardship perspective.
- The larger we get, the harder it is to keep the family atmosphere so many love. We will need to be intentional in finding new ways to help newcomers successfully assimilate relationally into the life of the church.

Future Goals

- This fall we are planning to run an Alpha program. It will be a big undertaking, but it is a practical way we can reach out to unchurched & de-churched people in our community.
- As a church, we do not have a strong community presence. Many have no idea we even exist in Kingston. To

- (1) connect with and find ways to support our area schools/teachers and (2) have a booth at the Kingston Steer BBQ and the CFB Greenwood "Wing Welcome" event.
- I anticipate new ministries beginning as we continue to grow and develop. This will be dependent on finding volunteers and making sure we don't "stretch ourselves too thin." A regular women's ministry is being planned for the fall. I'm also in talks about starting a kid's mid-week program.

Glancing back over this past year, God's faithfulness has been evident. He has blessed NH – Kingston this past year and I'm believing this is only the beginning - so long as we abide in Him before everything else. It has been my joy and privilege to serve as campus pastor.

GEMS MINISTRY REPORT

I didn't realize when I took over GEMS in 2022 just how much I would enjoy it, but this ministry is so much fun! I love working with our girls (grades 2-8) by teaching them about Jesus, having so many laughs together, and getting to know them. They are a wonderful group of young women, and I am excited to see where God will take them!

- We have a total of 20 girls in our GEMS group (14 last year)! This is the most we've had in a long time. We look forward to opening our doors to more in the Fall.
- We have 4 leaders that help me plan the year and execute each Friday night. We may be adding another leader in the Fall, which is so exciting!
- Each week, our girls learn how to *Act Justly, Love Mercy, and Walk Humby with our God* (Micah 4:8). We were able to teach them this through the curriculum that the program provided (it is very easy to follow!). Through this, we rotate on a 3-week teaching schedule:
 - Lesson nights (teaching about the Bible), Micah Missions (helping those in our community), and Badge nights (opportunities to learn useful skills from others, see below). We also have parties for special occasions, like Christmas, Valentine's, etc.
- We had 3 badge nights. Here, the girls learned
 - How to use the Cricut Machine by Sarah Brown, How to Worship Jesus by Bonnie Durling, and How to take care for Smokey the miniature horse by Heather and Chris Slauenwhite.
- We had a GEMS Sunday on May 26th to give the church an update on this ministry and to ask for support in our Bottle Drive fundraiser (which we are partnering in with the Cadets ministry).

One of the high points of this ministry has been seeing the girls really take in the Gospel message each week. I can see it on some of their faces that they are truly digesting it and taking it to heart. This encourages me and our leaders so much!

One of the difficulties I've faced is that we meet bi-weekly on Friday nights and because of my work schedule, Fridays are usually my day off, so it would be nice if we could move this ministry to a different night. However, this isn't always possible for our girls because of other commitments. We will reevaluate this in the Fall.

CADETS MINISTRY REPORT

We are coming to a close of Cadets for another year. Our goal this year, as always, is to have fun, play games, learn skills, explore different activities, but most of all, to start or continue building a relationship with our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, and with each other.

This year our numbers have diminished very slightly. We have 10 boys registered, with an average of 7 attending per meeting. I have to say, this is always a struggle for me when the numbers go down. We do need to do more outreach, which I admit is a struggle of mine and obviously should not be. I own it, and through God's strength, I hope to get better at it. But, back to the positive; we also have 5 Adult Counsellors, some of whom are helping out part time. So we continue to have a great Cadet to Counsellor ratio.

Our theme this season is "Rooted and Grounded", based on Ephesians 3:17-18, which says "And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power,... to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ." On our kick off night we made up teams and we picked weeds from the lawn to see who could get the longest one and then went up to the lobby to estimate and discover how long and tall the lobby was. We made a bit of a competition out of it, which was fun. We then related what we discovered to our theme.

Throughout the year we have revisited the theme, emphasizing how important it is to rooted and grounded in Christ. We have also talked about striving for the goal of being Christlike, building each other up, and listening for God's voice, amongst others.

Our meetings start out with an active game of some sort. We then "fall in" and the Cadets recite their Motto, Verse, Code and Pledge and end with a rousing rendition of our Cadet song, "Living for Jesus". Next, we have the devotional time mentioned above, with a lesson, discussion and prayer.

This part of the night has been a real blessing this year. The boys seem very engaged in the topics, identifying with what we are talking about and participating in meaningful discussions. IMMIGRANT CONNECTION REPORT

Background

Interestingly, as of today's, we are seeing more and more newcomers from around the globe heading their way to the Annapolis Valley. Like most universities, Acadia-U strives continually to lure international students to their campus. The overseas students population has gone up to 4,000 odd, a number which is much higher as compared to the pre-COVID's past. Likewise, the Kingstec campus of NSCC has also experienced a substantial increase in enrolment number of International students. Most of them are matured students; majority are from Africa, plus a handful from nations such as Philippines, India, China, S Korea and HK. Some of them landed here with their spouses and children while others arrived here alone, leaving behind their family back home (home country). Almost all have chosen the pathway as international students, so as to be eligible for application towards permanent residency. Unlike the past years, the retention rate of today's graduating students is so much higher. One great incentive is that their schooling kids are entitled to free education in the public schools, from pre-primary to grade 12. As a result, these newcomers who came as a family, tend to stay on in Nova Scotia upon graduation for the long haul.

Praise Items

Aug. to Sept. 2023

- As usual, it was the time of the year when International students would arrive. More often than not, one would see social media posts, many of which were related to housing needs. You could tell the urgency of those posts, and the sense of frustration among those newcomer students, seeking high and low for a roof over their heads. I thank God for He has never failed. Time again and again, he turns every crisis into an opportunity. That student in need was grateful for a Canadian family who took him in for a night. I worked behind the scene to have a room arranged for him the next day. It was a rewarding experience to hear that both of them sharing the apartment unit, got along well. It brought me JOY to see them in- person pre-Christmas 2023.

Labour Day Weekend, 2023

- The same Canadian family had an 'open house' on a Saturday. All in all, ten of us gathered for an outdoor BBQ. The host was so delighted to meet new faces while catching up with the familiar ones. We had had a great time enjoying BBQ meats and salads, and playing traditional games on their backyard, Thereafter, most of us reclined to our seats, relaxing and chatting away until it was time to go home. We merely spread out in pairs to allow one-on-one conversation. It was through such conversations that we got to hear their stories, their struggles as newcomers and their anticipated dreams for their future in Canada.

Pre-Christmas, Mid-December 2023

- It had been a privilege, an honour to have met those two cousins, K and W, Chinese from Malaysia. The fact that we crossed paths had to do with their housing needs. They were in a dire situation when they realized they were cheated of their cash, nearly \$3,000 in CAD through a SCAM. They were made aware like 3 days prior to their departure for Nova Scotia. By God's grace, through my channels of connections, they found themselves a living space through the lead provided. It was uplifting and encouraging to have those two young adults made their way from Glace Bay, Cape Breton to Kentville to visit me. Thanks to the same Canadian couple who hosted them for two nights. They had an amazing time as I brought them around to see places and do things together. They told me two events stood out, one of which was an evening meeting the Asians in town through a potluck while the other was a pre- Christmas Carolling and Dessert night at New Hope Wesleyan. Praise God, the Gospel that was presented through the multi-media animations and everything else did stir up their souls and beings, based on the feedback gathered. May the sowing of seeds comes to fruition in His time; that they may encounter Jesus some day down the road as they pursue their new life in Canada.

Where Can We Meet Newcomers From Abroad

Valley Community Learning Association (VCLA)

- Community Garden: I am so thankful that I got accepted as one of them, though I am a volunteer at heart. I find working in the garden a good therapy for my soul and being, mentally, emotionally and physically. I met different people as they showed up as volunteers. Apart from Canadians, there were newcomers from afar, such as Ecuador, Jamaica, S Africa, Mexico, Venezuela, India, and HK.
- Community Supper: More often than not, some newcomers may stay behind for supper. Needless to say, food brings people together, especially the like-minded ones who enjoy gardening as well as helping out at the kitchen, cleaning up and housekeeping as a community. I thank God for using me as a Connector, bringing in a chef from outside VCLA; allowing us all to have an International meal at least once a month. From tantalizing HK Chinese food, Vietnamese's, Malaysian's to sumptuous traditional treats such as Middle-eastern, Northern Indian; there is something to satisfy every palate!
- In other words, VCLA community hub is like a field full of harvest, where labourers are needed. With much delight, I want to acknowledge a Hope Huddle group, who take time and efforts to cook up a Thanksgiving meal, two years in a row for the community at large. Of course, it is my prayer that many more Christ followers will show up any other time of the year to bring Christ's love and healing into their midst. People are constantly in need of a listening ear, or a helping hand, whatever that might be.


