





### LEAD PASTOR REPORT

This past year has been a testimony to God's provision and the faithfulness of His people. As one church in multiple locations, we've committed to doing **Whatever It Takes** to see lives changed by the Hope of Jesus - and what a year it has been!

#### **A God-Sized Vision**

In **2024**, we boldly launched our "**Whatever It Takes**" Campaign, trusting God to move through His people in radical generosity and courageous obedience.

Over \$532,384 was pledged over two years to support this mission. We praise God that, to date, \$335,605 has already been received. Your faithfulness is making a difference!

Because of your giving, we're seeing vision become reality:

- We will launch our newest location in Windsor in October 2025, expanding our reach into a new community hungry for Hope.
- A new roof has been completed at our Kentville location, ensuring long-term sustainability for our ministry in Kentville.
- We're thrilled to announce that on June 17, 2025, the mortgage at our Kentville location will be paid in full. A
  massive milestone in our journey of faithful stewardship. It will be the first time in twenty years that New
  Hope has been debt-free. We will celebrate this achievement on June 22, 2025, at our Kentville location.

Each of these steps enhances our capacity to minister more effectively as one church across multiple locations.

#### **A Historic Year**

We also celebrated our highest combined attendance ever, with a weekly average of **345** people gathering for worship across our campuses. However, beyond the numbers, it's the stories behind the stats that truly reflect God's work among us:

- 23 people gave their lives to Christ
- 12 people were baptized as a public declaration of their faith in Christ
- 16 Hope Huddles (small discipleship groups) are continuing to add spiritual strength to New Hope
- 5 Baby Dedications, as families commit their children to the Lord

These moments represent real transformation. This is what it means to be the Church on mission - doing **Whatever It Takes** to make Jesus known.

In **2 Kings 4:1-7**, a widow faced a crisis and sought help from the prophet Elisha with only a small jar of oil. As she heeded God's instructions, gathering jars and pouring out what little she possessed, God performed a miracle. The oil kept flowing until every jar was filled to capacity.

This is our story as a church.

We've brought what we have - our time, gifts, and resources - and placed them in God's hands. He is multiplying it beyond what we could imagine. As long as there are empty jars and people in need of hope, we will keep gathering, keep pouring, and keep believing... because God is not finished.

### **Looking Ahead**

The upcoming year holds even greater promise. With the Windsor location launching, Kentville soon becoming mortgage-free, and Kingston poised for continued growth through two Sunday services, we step into the future with confidence in Christ and deep gratitude to our Saviour.

We will not settle for small dreams. We will continue to be a church that does **Whatever It Takes** to reach the lost, love our communities, and raise up disciples.

The prophet said, "Do not ask for just a few." **2 Kings 4:3** Let's continue to prepare for more, because God still has jars to fill.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Together, as one church with multiple locations, we are bringing the Hope of Jesus to the communities of Nova Scotia and beyond.

Thank you to Pastor Scott, our incredible staff, the church board, and to you - our entire church family - for your support, encouragement, and the many ways you've expressed appreciation towards Mariah and I. Also, your love for our daughter Nora means so much! We feel motivated to give our best to God, His Church, and our community.

I've had the joy of participating in several meaningful ministry moments, such as:

- Witnessing our church respond with sacrificial generosity and commitment to our 'Whatever It Takes' initiative to bring the hope of Jesus to communities in our province, and eliminate our Kentville mortgage!
- Welcoming **Rev. Jason Parker** to our pastoral staff! Jason is a faithful, passionate follower of Jesus and respected pastor on our district. We're so blessed to have him, Carolina and their family with us as they prepare to launch our Windsor campus!
- Experiencing powerful worship moments. You've likely sensed what I have that God has truly been "inhabiting the praises of His people" (Psalm 22:3) ... There is such a **sweet presence of God's Spirit** when His people lift high the name of Jesus! I am so grateful for the privilege it is to help lead our church in worship each week.
- Preached **10 sermons**. I enjoy every opportunity to share & unpack God's Word in the most practical ways.
- Participating in a leadership Co-Hort since January 2024 with a dozen Assistant Pastors (Wesleyan Churches). Led by our District Superintendent, Rev. Peter Moore, this co-hort has been a valuable time of growth, encouragement and leadership investment.

- <u>Updates</u>: 4 additional LED lights for stage designs. 3 new vocal microphones in Kingston. New digital snake in Kingston to improve sound quality. New electronic drum-set and piano pedal in Kentville.
- I assisted Pastor Scott in planning and leading Kentville's monthly **THRIVE** services. These evenings included: worship, Q&A testimonies, videos, Scriptures, devotional thoughts and focused prayer.
  - a) In Sept. 2024, Pastor Dave appointed Heather Jackson to lead THRIVE in Kingston this took a responsibility off of my plate. Huge thanks to Heather for creatively & faithfully planning these services!
- I oversaw the planning of our family-fun event, 'Carols & Desserts' (Dec. 8 '24) at our Kentville campus. Over 170 people attended this joy-filled evening that included: classic carols, a children's moment, interactive readings, door prizes and laughter (including a cupcake to my face from Mariah!)
  - a) Special thanks to Alex Sanford & members of the Kentville & Kingston worship team who passionately led the carols, along with Heather Hockley, Susan Amirault (+Huddle) for planning and serving the delicious festive desserts! Also, to all those who contributed!
- I oversaw our Christmas Eve Services (Kentville & Kingston) which included: carols, a family video reading the Christmas story, creative dance (special thanks to Emmanuelle & Ellington), a hope-filled message, candle-lighting, and post-service egg nog & apple-cider! 300+ people that attended (Kentville & Kingston)
  - a) Due to high RSVP numbers, we added a 2pm service in Kentville alongside our 4pm & 6pm services!
  - b) Special thanks to Pastors Mariah & Karen, Heather Hockley & Susan Amirault (check-in), and Jim Hockley for overseeing the parking team.
- Pastor Scott and I planned our Easter Weekend Services (April 18 & 20 '24)

### CHILDREN'S PASTOR REPORT

Hello New Hope Family,

It has been a privilege to serve alongside each of you in the HopeKids Ministry again this year. Thanks to God's guidance, your prayers/support, and our amazing team of leaders, the this ministry continues to grow and more children are learning about God's love for them. Here's a glimpse of how God's been at work over this past year.

#### Stats:

Our numbers continue to grow, with an average weekly attendance of:

- **49** kids (Kentville)
- 28 kids (Kingston)

Since May 2024, we have welcomed **10 new leaders** to our team:

- Kentville: 6 leaders
- Kingston: 4 leaders

We also had a total of **5 child dedications** (3 in Kentville, 2 in Kingston). Praise God families who are committing themselves to living for Him, and for a church to support them with love, guidance, and prayer.

#### **Events/Special Sundays:**

All events occurred in both Kentville & Kingston, except for: OCC HopeKids Moment & Easter Eggstravaganza.

- **Birthday Bash:** June 2<sup>nd</sup> & Nov 24<sup>th</sup> This was our first year doing these events. The Birthday Bashes happen 2x a year to celebrate our HopeKids birthdays (Jan-June in June, July-Dec in November). During these mornings, we took a break from our regular curriculum and hosted a "birthday party" for our HopeKids. These mornings have been a fun way to make our HopeKids feel special and get excited about coming to church!
- Special Sundays: Summer 2024 These Sundays were primary planned by our Summer Student, Bronwyn, to help keep children excited about coming to church during the summer months when attendance tends to dip. Each of these mornings were a great success and enjoyed by many! "School's Out!" Bash (June 30th), Christmas in July (July 7th), Water Sundays (July 28th & August 18th), Tropical Sunday (August 4th)
- Kickoff Sunday: September 15th Bouncy castle, face paint, outdoor games
- **Pumpkin Bash: October 27**th Pumpkin carving, chili, face paint, pumpkin races. Each year, we see more members of our community attending this event!
- Operation Christmas Child: Nov. 17<sup>th</sup> We spent the month of November focusing on the importance of OCC & had Pastor Karen explain the mission behind these shoeboxes. Our HopeKids delivered their shoeboxes to the front of the sanctuary & joined the church congregation in prayer before sending these boxes overseas.

- **Dough Holy Night:** Dec. 15<sup>th</sup> Interactive Family Program. 100+ people in attendance, and 20+ volunteers.
- **Eggstravaganza:** April 19<sup>th</sup> 400+ people in attendance & 40+ volunteers/staff serving. 56% of children in attendance were not connected with our church. Amazing opportunity to open our doors to the community!

#### **Sunday Morning Updates:**

- In October 2024, we made the transition to use Grow curriculum. This curriculum is used for both children & teens in our church and focuses on getting our kids into the Word of God. It's been well received by both children and leaders.
  - Our HopeKids have continued to be engaged in our monthly memory verse challenge this past year. It's been so encouraging to see the kids memorize scripture and become more familiar with how to navigate their Bibles. This has been a major benefit with our new curriculum.
  - We've also purchased several kid-friendly Bibles to provide children/families with. We've handed out close to 10 Bibles this Spring alone!
- In October 2024, we also launched more formal programming in our Hope Garden classroom (ages 18 months-3 years). This program includes singing, a story time, and crafts/activities. Special thanks to Peggy Abriel, who brought this curriculum to the church and has helped to oversee the program.
  - \*\*Due to a shortage in leaders, we currently only offer this program during the 9:30AM service (Hope Garden during the 11AM service is more of a "playroom"). The goal for this next year is to recruit more leaders so that we can implement this program during both services.

We were fortunate to have Bronwyn Knowlton as our summer student from May-August 2023, and are thrilled to have her back again this year. Bronwyn is creative, hardworking, and has a heart for children. She's passionate about helping to make our Sunday morning programs fun and engaging, while also ensuring that our HopeKids learn more about their relationship with God. Thanks for all you do, Bronwyn!

As I prepare to be on maternity leave from July 2025-2026, I am reminded again that this is not my ministry and that I am not in charge. God has been so faithful to New Hope and the HopeKids Ministry, and I'm looking forward to seeing what **He** accomplishes this next year.

### **CAMPUS PASTOR REPORT**

Below are a few highlights from this past church year, along with some challenges and goals for the year ahead.

#### **Highlights**

- In July we entered a float in the Kingston Steer BBQ **parade**, which included a live band (our worship team). Almost 25 volunteers took part.
- We now have our own **Facebook page**, helping us to better communicate what's going on in the life of this location.
- Within the community, NH Kingston participated in the following ministries: Christmas food hampers, Heart of the Valley Nursing Home, the Upper Room Food Bank, and Blessings in a Backpack (BIAB).
- Throughout the summer we had four **summer potlucks** on Sunday evenings. They were fun times of food & fellowship. Attendance was in the 40-65 range.
- Our **THRIVE** services have been spiritually rich, and attendance has quadrupled from last year.
- NH Kingston has a **new staff member**. My wife Melissa began working five hours a week to clear some administrative tasks from my plate. She has been a great asset!
- We ran the **Alpha Course** in the fall for the first time. Weekly attendance was between 35-40. We saw some of our unchurched guests experience salvation or take spiritual 'steps' towards Jesus including faithfully attending church. Our people stepped up to make this a success (27 volunteers).
- Our location participated in a week of **prayer & fasting** in January. I was encouraged with the engagement and believe we have been experiencing the spiritual blessings that came from it.
- We are steadily **growing**. Both Christmas Eve (182) & Easter (159) saw record attendance for us. Due to space constraints, we are now offering two Sunday morning services (9:30am & 11am). Our church has been dedicated and supportive of this change. The phrase I hear over and over is "Whatever it takes!"

#### Challenges

- The larger we get, the harder it is to keep the family atmosphere so many have come to love about NH Kingston. We will need to be intentional in creating spaces that continue to foster deepening relationships.
- Several of our ministries need more volunteers. New volunteers will need to be identified and trained in order to keep up with growing ministry demands.

#### **Future Goals**

- This fall we are running Alpha again. The intent is to further reach unchurched & dechurched people in our community with the saving power of Jesus.

- We will continue to increase our community presence – especially in our schools. Through existing relationships, God seems to be opening a door for us at Kingston & District School.

Glancing back over this past year, God's faithfulness has been evident. He has blessed NH – Kingston this past year and I know He will be with us as we continue to walk step in step with Him. It has been my joy and privilege to serve as campus pastor.

## **GEMS MINISTRY REPORT**

When Pastor Megan asked me to take over the GEMS ministry while she was on maternity leave, I knew from being a leader with GEMS since 2017 that it was not a one person ministry so I requested that Rachel be my sidekick and I am so grateful that Rachel agreed. Together we have the opportunity and privilege to teach these young girls all about God and that He not only loves them, but He also has great plans for their lives. Our girls are awesome and we are excited to see them grow in their love for God over the time we spend with them in the GEMS ministry each year.

- We have a total of 21 girls who regularly attend our GEMS group (20 last year) along with the casual friends some of our girls bring with them. We hope to have more this coming Fall.
- We have four leaders beside Rachel and I who help us with crafts, games, snacks and the planning of each GEMS year. We will be down one leader this coming Fall as she is expecting her first baby in September!
- Each week our girls learn that our **God Is Unshakeable and His Promises are Unbreakable!** Psalm 62:2 reads, "He alone is my rock and my salvation; He is my fortress; I shall not be greatly shaken."
- On lesson nights we taught our girls God's five promises to help them not to be shaken by things of this world. These five promises are *I Am Loved* (1 John 3:1), *I Am Not Alone* (Deuteronomy 31:6), *I Am Strong* (Philippians 4:13), *I Am Forgiven* (1 John 1:9) and *I Am A World Changer* (Micah 6:8). We encourage our girls to open their bibles and look up these verses and read them out loud to the group. Our girls get excited to do this and are very eager to volunteer to read out loud.
- We completed four badges this year. Caring For Animals, Rest & Relaxation, What Is The Bible, Relationships With Other People and Unshakeable. We had special guests on these nights to teach our girls special skills and they were a lot of fun!

Our GEMS leaders were a crucial part of this event as well. They helped with plating the food, cleaning the dishes and kitchen after the meal and supervising our girls throughout the event.

Lorraine Case and Bea Stanley catered the event with a delicious roast beef, mashed potato, veggies, gravy and cupcake dessert. Bea, Gordon, Lynn, Bob, myself and our daughter Jemma helped in setting up the tables and chairs and decorations which were provided by the lovely and talented Bea.

## **BIAB MINISTRY REPORT**

When **Pastor Karen** approached me with the opportunity of taking over the Blessings In A Backpack ministry, I was honoured and excited to have the opportunity to make a difference in children's lives through the weekly provision of food over their weekends when not attending classes in school. This ministry is a great way to show God's children, all of their family, neighbours, friends and school staff that someone cares about them and values them.

- The 2024/2025 year we have had a consistent 13 volunteers (including myself and our daughter Jemma) and four new volunteers, totalling 17 volunteers who help with packing and/or delivering the food every week.
- One of our church interns studying at Kingswood, **Will**, has been helping Jemma and I with organizing the food on Wednesday mornings so that those volunteers who help pack and deliver the food on Thursday mornings can go as smoothly as possible.
- I am happy to introduce the opportunity of new volunteers who are only available Wednesdays and are only able to pack the food, not deliver it, starting this *May 2025*. Welcome *Tamara Marshall & Shannon Wheeler!* When they are scheduled during the month, two other volunteers will be scheduled that Thursday morning to simply pick up the bags of food and deliver them to Aldershot and KCA Elementary Schools.
- Once I took over this ministry I implemented that myself and the volunteers on Thursdays hold hands and pray over the food before it reaches the children it is intended for by God. I believe God has plans for these children and in His time and His way, these children will learn of Him, His love for them, their true value through Chirst Jesus and perhaps one day have a personal relationship with Him.
- Christmas 2024, the Women's Ministry donated \$300.00 dollars so that I could purchase Christmas stockings for our children in the Blessings In A Backpack ministry and fill them with chocolate, candy, toys, crafts and whatever else might bring them some joy during this time of year. I am certain the children who received this generous gift were without a doubt filled with some joy, laughter and love during what is for some of them a very difficult time of year. Thank you Women's Ministry for your love and support to this ministry!
- On Sunday, March 16, 2025, Pastor Scott interviewed me during both morning services to help bring awareness to the Blessings In A Backpack ministry, to gain more volunteers and to educate the church congregation on the amount of funds that is required to provide food to the children at Aldershot and KCA Elementary schools every week.
- **Heather Hockley** provided bookmarks with food donation ideas for people to purchase and drop off throughout the week.
- Pastor Jedie made a Blessings In A Backpack sign display with these bookmarks and placed it in the
  upstairs lobby to encourage people to help donate food to this ministry. He also graciously donated a mini
  bar fridge for our Blessings In A Backpack room to store our cheese strings. High five to Pastor Jedie:)

One highlight this year was when after my interviews on March 16, 2025 with Pastor Scott, several *Hope Huddles* decided that as part of their monthly missions week they would make cash and/or food donations to Blessings In A Backpack. It filled my heart with joy to walk in on any random day of the week and be pleasantly surprised with someone(s) coming toward me with bags of food donations or I would walk into the Blessings room where our food is stored and see boxes of food on the tables and floor that had been donated when I was not there. Some donated cash through the church website and that was awesome to know as well. Every donation big or small makes a **HUGE** difference in running this ministry. I want to personally thank all of you for your donations, prayers and support. I couldn't provide food for these children without you. **THANK YOU!!** 

One challenge I faced with this ministry was learning to keep track of our food inventory, organizing and scheduling volunteers, and maintaining a safe and organized work space. Our daughter, Jemma Langley, has helped me in all of these areas. I am **VERY** proud of her and thankful that God chose me to be her mom. I could not have done this ministry well without her. *I love you Jemma*.

Our hopes and plans for this ministry in 2025/2026 is to look at the possibility of gaining more financial funds from other resources such as grants and/or burserises so that one day we might be able to provide more food to more children in more schools in our local communities or at least more children in the schools we currently provide for. Should we pursue this, we will be looking for another person or persons to take over this responsibility.

I want to thank everyone for their prayers, support, and commitment to this ministry. I strongly believe **God** will continue to use this ministry as a way to share **His** love for these children in hopes that one day they will come to have a real relationship with **Him** and know of a better life with **Him** in it. **Amen**.

## **GRIEFSHARE MINISTRY REPORT**

No matter what the circumstances, grief is a painful process. Our GriefShare grief support group is for people dealing with the death of a family member or friend.

GriefShare is a safe, welcoming place where people understand the difficult emotions of grief. Over thirteen weeks, participants find relief and comfort as they learn what to expect and how to navigate the personal grief process. Since there are no neat, orderly stages of grief, participants learn helpful ways of coping with grief, in all its unpredictability—and gain solid support each step of the way.

Topics include how to manage grief-related emotions such as loneliness, anxiety, sadness, anger, and regret; how to cope with the changes in your life and relationships; how to recognize what's normal in grief; and what to do if you feel stuck or hopeless.

At a weekly GriefShare meeting, we view a video featuring respected counselors, teachers, and healthcare professionals on grief-related topics. After that is a small-group discussion for sharing, support, and personal application of what you learned on the video. Participants receive a book to take home filled with valuable exercises for navigating the personal grieving process. New Hope provides these workbooks to those attending GriefShare FREE of charge.

New Hope Kentville offers the 13 week GriefShare program twice a year. The Fall semester began Sept 12, 2024 with Dave and Agnes Hazelwood, Honey Young, Rudy Halbersma, and Bernadine Gerrits acting as facilitators/cofacilitators. We had 16 people register for the Fall group with 3 of those being folks that attend New Hope.

On Saturday, November 30/24 we ran "Surviving The Holidays". This is a two-hour special event that functions just like a typical GriefShare session. It's designed to: Help the bereaved through the difficult holiday season/Serve existing GriefShare group members/Grow the current ministry/Be a major outreach into the community. Eight people attended the event along with the five leaders.

Our Winter semester began Feb 27/25. We are blessed to have Honey Young, Rudy Halbersma, Austinn Buckley, and Bernadine Gerrits co-facilitate the meetings. We have 20 participants registered (6 who have come back for a second time). Most of the participants come from outside of New Hope. We are really getting to know each other as we move through the sessions. Our 'graduation session' will be June 5 when we hope to have a potluck supper together and go over the exercises in our workbooks for session 13.

We hope to resume a new Fall semester at the beginning of September/25 DV.

We ask that you pray for more people to take on different leadership roles in our ministry team and for stamina for those that currently help to lead. Please also remember to pray for the participants and for future participants as well.

We are very thankful to New Hope for making the church available to run the GriefShare program and for the continued support to those that are grieving as we journey from mourning to joy.

- Restaurants want to know in case they have to bring in more help.
- If we have the breakfast at a home, the host needs some lead time to purchase the required amount of food.
- A club or Organization also need lead time to prepare as well.

#### **SPECIAL NOTES**

- We were **Blessed** to have Pastor Scott Prime as our **guest speaker** on November 16.
- The **June & December** Breakfasts were held at New Hope Kingston.
- It works well at the church, but the preparation & cleanup requires teamwork and has worked without a hitch.
- Our Men's **Christmas Breakfast** was well attended, and we had activities & treats held in a joyous atmosphere which included a typical Yahnke Swap.
- The September 21 Breakfast was cancelled.

## **WOMEN'S MINISTRY REPORT**

In Spring 2024, God put it on my heart to start a women's ministry at New Hope Kingston campus. After attending the Women's Breakfast in Kentville and discussing informally with several women in the church, it became clear a women's ministry was desired in Kingston. This would not be to compete with, but to complement the Kentville Women's ministry.

We had our first Women's Gathering on April 20 2024 as a stand alone event with a movie night. This was organized by myself (Karen Tucker), Debbie MacLean, Melissa Tysick and Heather Jackson.

In the fall of 2024 Debbie MacLean and I officially started the Hope Women ministry.

**Hope Women** aims to encourage the women of the Kingston New Hope community. The meetings are relatively informal but have Biblically-based teaching. This ministry aims to help women use the gifts God has given them to mentor and encourage each other (Titus 2). We try to meet the last Saturday morning of every month. Each meeting has a topic/theme, and we ask a different woman in the congregation to talk to us from a Godly and personal perspective based on that theme.

Our three areas of focus for each Hope Women gathering are:

- Connective: involving all the women who with social time, coffee, tea and a snack of some kind
- **Spiritual:** encouraging word from a speaker from New Hope, discussing missions within the Annapolis Valley; prayer and Biblically based teaching is weaved into each activity
- Hands On: a craft or activity that involves all women if possible

We have had 5 regular monthly events, two in fall 2024 (October 26, November 30) and three so far in 2025 (February 22, March 29 and April 26). The next will be May 31, 2025 with a possible end event in June, then resuming in September 2025. Attendance has been generally in the low 20s, ranging from 17 women (April 2025) to 27 women (March 2025). Unless we have an event where supplies and pricing dictate numbers, we decided not to require registration for any Hope Women gathering.

Challenges we have faced mainly concern scheduling around other events at the church (e.g. Men's Breakfast and Kentville Women's Breakfast). We acknowledge conflicts have and will occur in the future,

Overall I have received positive feedback on the monthly events. One of the highlights was the accessory exchange in November in which ladies had fun trading accessories in a White Elephant style exchange! The most enjoyable part for me has been allowing women who may not be as social or involved in other church activities to get to know each other and share in a safe, loving Christian environment. I pray for the ministry of Hope Women as we continue in 2025.




