Big Idea: Rebuilding requires commitment, not convenience. Revival becomes real when it changes how we live daily.

1. Living According to God's _____ (Nehemiah 10:28–31)

- The people committed to obey God fully, not picking and choosing.
- Obedience included separating from influences that lead away from God and honoring His commands in daily life.
- Covenant renewal begins with Scripture as the authority for how we live.

- Where in my life have I drifted from God's Word?
 - How can I recommit to living fully under God's guidance daily?
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2. Honoring God's _____ (Nehemiah 10:31, 33)

- The people pledged to observe the Sabbath and holy days, trusting God over the marketplace.
- Honoring God's time is about rhythm, rest, and worship, not mere obligation.
- Our schedule reflects what or whom we truly serve.

Reflection Questions:

- How do I use my weekly and daily time?
 - Am I living according to God's rhythm, or the world's pace?
 - What changes can I make to prioritize worship and rest?
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3. _____ **Generously** (Nehemiah 10:32–39)

- They committed to support the temple and the work of God’s house, even in times of scarcity.
- Giving shows where our trust and priorities lie.
- Generosity is a tangible expression of covenant commitment.

Reflection Questions:

- Is my giving regular, proportional, and sacrificial?
- How can I put God first in my finances and resources?
- What step of generosity can I take this season?
